Report of the Strategic Director of Communities and Place

Bereavement Services Fees and Charges 2018

SUMMARY

1.1 The annual review of Bereavement Services Fees and Charges has traditionally been included in the overall review of Communities, Environment and Regulatory Services Directorate Fees and Charges. This is done in line with the fiscal year. However, this report proposes that the review of Bereavement Services Fees and Charges is aligned with the calendar year and if approved comes into effect on 1 January 2018.

RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To approve the increase in Bereavement Services Schedule of Fees and Charges for 2018 as set out at Appendix 2 effective from 01 January 2018.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 To enable Bereavement Services to contribute to the Communities, Environment and Regulatory Services Directorate Budget for 2017/18 and 2018/19
- 3.2 To adjust the cost of providing graves to accommodate Vaulted Chambers to ensure parity with other charges.
- 3.3 To adjust the cost of an interment in a Vaulted Chamber to reflect the cost of provision.
- 3.4 To enable bereavement services to manage unbudgeted repairs and maintenance to plant and equipment in-year financial pressures.
- 3.5 To ensure that Bereavement Services is in the best position to manage increasing commercial pressures on the service from private sector crematoria.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 As part of the 2017/18 budget management and 2018/19 budget preparation processes, within the Communities and Place Directorate, Bereavement Services have reviewed their fees and charges to ensure that:
 - a) Any in-year budgetary pressures are managed;

- b) Inflationary cost increases are incorporated into the charging structure where applicable;
- c) Additional costs of providing the service are reflected in the level of fees and charges levied;
- d) They meet directorate budgetary targets;
- e) They are competitive with the regional and national averages.
- 4.2 Taking these factors into account it is proposed that, the Bereavement Services Fees and Charges are increased broadly in line with the national average increases of approximately 3% identified in the Royal London Annual Review of Funeral Costs. It is further proposed that the increase is effective from 1 January 2018.
- 4.3 In addition, Markeaton Crematorium is coming under increasing commercial pressure due to the recent opening of Amber Valley Crematorium at Swanwick and the building of a further crematorium at Aston-on Trent, which is planned to be open later this year. These private sector crematoria work on a calendar year business model, which means that our own fees and charges are out of line for part of the year, which brings additional commercial pressures on the service and confusion to the funeral directing sector.
- 4.4 As the design and layout of the burial sections to accommodate Casket and Vaulted burials is now the same, it is proposed that these charges are adjusted and merged into one fee.
- 4.5 A similar review of the Interment Fee in a Vaulted Grave has also concluded that due to the application of inflationary increase in previous years and as a result of the renegotiation of the contract and economies of scale, the cost of the vaults has reduced. It is therefore proposed that the Interment Fee in a Vaulted Grave is reduced
- 4.6 During the year it also became clear that there was a need to liberate existing management capacity to be better able to address the strategic issues facing the service including the competitive pressure from the opening of local private sector crematoria and the need to find land for a new cemetery. In addition, concerns were raised about the level of resilience in the service to discharge the statutory burial registration processes.
- 4.7 The proposed increases will enable the service to manage these pressures from a review in the establishment.
- 4.8 The proposal is To approve the increase in Bereavement Services Schedule of Fees and Charges for 2018 as set out at Appendix 2 effective from 01 January 2018.

IMPLICATIONS

Financial and Value for Money

1.1 The proposed fees and charges have been set to support Bereavement Services budgets. It is estimated that £18k additional income will be generated in 2017/18 with a full year effect of £70k based on current trends. This additional income will initially be used to support the service and potentially across the directorate. It will also bring with it some fiscal resilience as we prepare for the impact of the new private sector crematorium at Aston on Trent.
